Challenge Problems for Your Classroom

**Secondary Physics, Chemistry
and Math Teachers**

Learn how to develop Challenge Problems for your Physics, Chemistry, Math, or other calculation based class. All students are given what is effectively the same question, but each individual has unique numbers, and therefore a unique answer. The secret for the teacher is to have an Excel Spreadsheet that can check each students answer. Learn how to set up the Excel Spreadsheet to pull up an individual students data with one touch, how to distinguish between correct and incorrect answers, and how to password protect the sheet so students can't peek at their correct answer. This is similar to Internet Physics problems, but only requires 1 or 2 computers for an entire class. Come with several challenging problems you think you'd like to present to students in this format and a jump drive to save your work.
