The Copper Country ISD has an additional award to award to high ability middle school students for summer enrichment programs. Students may apply for up to \$205 in scholarship funds, which will cover a partial cost of a Michigan Technological University summer youth program at the commuter rate.


The forms necessary to apply for the money are available from counselors, school main offices and from our website, [www.copperisd.org](http://www.copperisd.org) under "gifted." There are two forms to be filled out if a student desires to attend the Michigan Tech summer youth program. One is the "CCISD scholarship application" and the other is a special "Michigan Tech Summer Youth program" application which is different than the regular summer youth forms. By utilizing the special application, students alert the MTU Summer Youth program staff that a CCISD scholarship has been requested. Because this scholarship program is aimed at high ability middle school students, the age requirements will be waived for students wishing to attend institutes geared for older students.

Students are free to choose programs other than the Michigan Tech Summer Youth program and in the event a student chooses this option, complete program information must be submitted along with the CCISD scholarship application. The maximum amount of funding a student can request remains at \$205 and payment will be made directly to the institution.

All application forms and supporting material needs to be submitted to the CCISD via US mail attention: Loret Roberts, no later than **June 1, 2009**. Late applications will not be considered. Questions can be directed to Loret or Carla at 482-0331.
